NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the Adoption of LCB File No. R020-16

Nevada Tax Commission

The Nevada Tax Commission will hold a Public Hearing at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, January 23, 2017 at the Gaming Control Board 1919 College Pkwy, Suite. 100, Carson City NV & Video Conferenced Gaming Control Board, Grant Sawyer State Office Building, 555 E Washington Ave, Room 2450, Las Vegas, NV. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested parties regarding the adoption of provisions that pertain to the Revised Proposed Permanent Regulation LCB File No. R020-16.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1. Need and purpose of the proposed regulations or amendments

The need and purpose of the revised proposed permanent regulation is to provide a timeframe and means in which the Department shall provide notice of changes in the sales and use tax rate imposed in the jurisdiction of a local government; revising provisions governing the exemption from the sales and use tax for food for human consumption; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

2. How to obtain the approved or revised text of regulations prepared by LCB

The proposed permanent regulation is also available for review and downloads on the Department of Taxation website https://tax.nv.gov/FAQs/SST/

3. Methods used in determining the impact on a small business

The agency used informed, reasonable judgment in determining that there will not be an impact on small businesses due to the nature of the regulation changes, which includes its own analysis by considering the extent of the regulatory provisions contained in LCB File No. R020-16. The Department prepared a small business impact statement questionnaire that was forwarded to the Interested Parties List which is maintained by the Department.

The Department will continue to accept input on the impact of the revised proposed permanent regulation on small businesses through the regulatory process. No respondents indicated that this regulation would have a direct and significant economic burden upon a small business.

The Department held a workshop for concerned members of the public to state their concerns and submit correspondence regarding the regulation. No correspondence was received at the 5/13/2016 workshop.

4. Estimated economic effect of regulations on business and the public

a. Adverse and beneficial effects

The revised proposed permanent regulation presents no reasonably foreseeable or anticipated adverse economic effects to businesses or to the general public.

b. Immediate and long-term effects

5. Cost for enforcement of the regulations

The revised proposed permanent regulation presents no significant foreseeable or anticipated cost or decrease in costs for enforcement.

6. Overlap or duplication of other state or local governmental agencies

The revised proposed permanent regulation does not overlap or duplicate any regulation of other state or local governmental entities.

7. Regulation required by federal law

Not applicable

8. More stringent than federal regulations

The Department is not aware of any similar federal regulations of the same activity in which the state regulations are more stringent.

9. New or increases in existing fees

The revised proposed permanent regulation doesn't include new or increases existing fees.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed action of the Nevada Tax Commission may appear at the above scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views, or arguments, in written form, to the Nevada Tax Commission, 1550 E. College Parkway, Suite 115, Carson City, Nevada 89706. Written submissions must be received by January 20, 2017 in order to be made available at the hearing.

A copy of this notice and the revised proposed permanent regulation to be adopted and amended will be on file at the Nevada State Library, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notice and the proposed permanent regulation to be adopted and amended will be available at the Department of Taxation, 1550 College Parkway, Carson City, Nevada; Department of Taxation, 4600 Kietzke Lane, Building L, Suite 235, Reno, Nevada; Department of Taxation, 555 East Washington Avenue, Suite 1300, Las Vegas, Nevada; Department of Taxation 2550 Paseo Verde Parkway, Suite 180, Henderson, Nevada; and in all counties in which an office of the Department of Taxation is not maintained, at the main public library, for inspection and copying by members of the public during business hours. The text of the revised proposed permanent regulation will include the entire text of any section of the Nevada Administrative Code, which is proposed for amendment or repeal. Copies will be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if deemed necessary.

Under NRS 233B.064(2), when adopting any regulation, the Agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either prior to adoption or within 30 days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporation, and its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.
