# **Taxable Sales by County**

The Nevada Department of Taxation released statewide taxable sales for January 2019, which total \$4,839,251,588. That marks a 7.7 percent increase over January 2018. Thirteen of Nevada's 17 counties recorded increases.

Eight out of the state's ten largest industry sectors saw year-over-year growth in January 2019. On-line/non-store retailers continue to experience large year-over-year growth due in part to new regulations expanding sales tax to more on-line retailers.

## Monthly Excise Tax Revenue Collections – January 2019

Excise tax collections totaled \$50,333,481 in January. Through the first seven months of the fiscal year, total excise tax collections are 4.1 percent higher than during the same period in Fiscal Year 2019.
