Taxable Sales by County

The Nevada Department of Taxation released statewide taxable sales for November 2019, which total \$5,418,306,263. That represents a six percent increase over November 2018. Thirteen of Nevada's 17 counties recorded increases.

Monthly Excise Tax Revenue Collections - November 2019

Monthly excise tax collections totaled \$56,487,907 in November, while the Commerce Tax (due annually) took in \$1,005,559 during the month. Nine of these eleven tax types saw increased revenue this fiscal year versus the prior fiscal year.
