The Nevada Department of Taxation released statewide taxable sales for September 2019, which total \$5,566,410,959. That represents a ten percent increase over September 2018. Thirteen of Nevada's 17 counties recorded increases.

Monthly Excise Tax Revenue Collections – September 2019

Monthly excise tax collections totaled \$51,796,013 in September, while the Commerce Tax (due annually) took in \$2,348,034 during the month. Nine of these tax types saw increased revenue this fiscal year versus the prior fiscal year.

Quarterly Excise Tax Revenue Collections – First Quarter, Fiscal Year 2020

Quarterly excise tax collections totaled \$293,818,547 in the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2020. The Bank Branch Excise Tax was the only quarterly tax type to see lower revenue this quarter compared to the prior fiscal year's first quarter.
