TAXATION REVENUE STATISTICS – February 2019

Taxable Sales by County

The Nevada Department of Taxation released state-wide taxable sales for February 2019, which total \$4,563,698,099. That is a 4.8 percent increase over February 2018. Ten of Nevada's 17 counties recorded increases.

Taxable Sales by Industry Sector

Six out of the State's ten largest industry sectors saw year-over-year growth in February 2019. On-line/non-store retailers continue to experience large year-over-year growth due in part to new regulations expanding sales tax to more on-line retailers.

Monthly Excise Tax Revenue Collections – February 2019

Excise tax collections totaled \$35,298,885 in February. Through the first eight months of the Fiscal Year, total excise tax collections are 2.7 percent higher than during the same period in Fiscal Year 2018.
