Adult-use marijuana sales begin July 1 and Nevada officials want you to know how to stay legal and safe

CARSON CITY – Adult-use marijuana sales begin in Nevada this Saturday, and the Department of Taxation, who is tasked with regulating the new industry, wants consumers and the public to know what's legal and what isn't, how to be safe if they consume marijuana, and how to keep kids safe.

"We want people to make choices that lead to safe experiences, both for themselves and for other people," said Deonne Contine, executive director of the Department. "To do that, they've got to have the right information."

Under the law, you still can't consume marijuana in public or in a moving vehicle, even if you are the passenger. If you drive under the influence of marijuana, you are likely to get a DUI. There are still restrictions on how much you can have in your possession – one ounce of marijuana or an eighth of an ounce of concentrate.

The only legal place to buy marijuana is from a state-licensed store, and there are some things consumers should know about the products they may find on the shelves in those stores.

"If Nevada is anything like Colorado, we're likely to see people who have only smoked marijuana in the past try different products, like edibles," said Contine.

The effect of edibles can be much stronger and take two hours or more before the consumer fully feels it. Because of this, officials caution consumers to start with one serving that has no more than 10 milligrams of THC, and wait at least two hours before having more. Check the labels on products before you buy so you know how much THC is in each product and serving size. Officials also caution that mixing marijuana with alcohol or prescription drugs can be dangerous.

The Department has established strict regulations to prevent marijuana products from appealing to kids, but they say parents and consumers also have a responsibility to keep those products where kids can't get to them. All marijuana should be kept in the child-resistant packaging it's sold in, and kept in a locked container up high and out of sight. Marijuana should be stored differently based on the ages of kids in the home. What works for a toddler is not likely to work for a curious teen.

To get the word out about laws and safety, the Department launched a website – *marijuana.nv.gov* – and a statewide public awareness campaign that will run radio and television public services announcements statewide in both English and Spanish.

The Department encourages would-be consumers to check the current list of licensed retail stores before they head out to buy and make sure they only buy from stores on that list. All other purchases are illegal. The Department will maintain a current list of retail licensees on its website (tax.nv.gov).
